

These Regulations may be called Dr. C.V. Raman University (Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2022.

They shall come into force from the next academic session of the University. (Only for those registered on or after 7th November, 2022. All scholars registered before the date will be governed by earlier rules)

1. About DR. C.V. Raman University

Dr. C.V. Raman University was set up as Chhattisgarh's first private university on 3rd November 2006 and inaugurated on 14th October 2007, over a vast area of 70 acres with excellent infrastructure in the tribal region of Kota, District Bilaspur in Chhattisgarh. The university was established under Niji Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam 2005. Over the years, the university has established itself as the research and educational hub of the region, covering a wide expanse of courses and fields like engineering, management, arts, science, education, law, IT, etc. The university started functioning as per its approved status and ordinances from the academic year (2007-08). It is recognized by UGC and approved by AICTE, NCTE, BCI as well as certified by ISO: 9001:2008, a member of AIU, accredited with A grade by NAAC, listed in NIRF ranking. It is listed in Top 30 Engineering Colleges in India (INDIA TODAY 2018).

Vision

Dr. C. V. Raman University will have a transformative impact on society through continual innovation in education, research, creativity and entrepreneurship incorporating social, ethical, human and spiritual values.

Mission

2. Objectives in a statement represent the land of a release of

The objectives of the Ph.D. program are to keep pace with the expanding frontiers of knowledge and to provide research training relevant to the present socio-economic and technological need of the country. The University also undertakes research and development projects from industrial and other organizations in the public as well as private sector.

3. Eligibility criteria for admission to the Ph.D. Programme

- 3.1 Candidates for admission to the Ph.D. programme shall have a Master's degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed).
- 3.2 A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-abled and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time. The eligibility marks of 55% (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible based only on the qualifying marks without including the grace mark procedures.

4. Duration of the Programme

- 4.1 Ph.D. programme shall be for a minimum duration of three (3) years, including course work and a maximum of six (6) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D programme. Their surrounds not operatively a familiar
- 4.2 A maximum of an additional two (2) years can be given through a process of reregistration as per the Statute/Ordinance of the Higher Educational Institution concerned; provided, however, that the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme should not exceed eight (8) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme
- 4.3 The women candidates and Persons with Disability (more than 40% disability) may be allowed a relaxation of two (2) years for Ph.D. in the maximum duration. The total period for completion of Ph.D programme in such case should not exceed ten (10) year from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.

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In addition, the women candidates may be provided Maternity Leave once in the entire duration of Ph.D. for up to three months.

5. Procedure for Admission

- 5.1 The University will invite applications from the scholars by its announcement to admissions through advertisement of Admission Notification in the press, electronic media or on the website. Scholars, who intend to register for Ph.D., have to apply in a prescribed form available on the website as well as in the University Admission Office.
- **5.2** Admission to the Ph.D. programme shall be based on the University Entrance Test, followed by an interview of the eligible scholars.
- 5.3 Entrance test may be waived by the University Research and Innovation Committee (URIC) for the richly experienced scholars from the industry in special cases only.
- 5.4 In case of Research Fellows (JRF, SRF etc.) or Research Associates connected with the Sponsored/Funded Research Projects and those who have been appointed through proper procedure set by the University/permitted by the VC may be deemed to be eligible for admission to the Ph.D. course, on recommendation of the concerned guide, without taking entrance test. Such scholars will be admitted to the Ph.D. course at any time during the year.
- 5.5 At the time of Pre-Ph.D. Interview, Candidates and Scholars are expected to discuss their research interest/area through a presentation before the Research Committee and submit a research proposal along with the work-plan. It shall also consider whether
- a. The candidate possesses the competence for the proposed research.
- b. The research work can be suitably undertaken at the Institution/University.
- c. The proposed area of research can contribute to new/additional knowledge and significance to the society.
- 5.6 The number of seats for Ph.D. will depend on vacant seats available in the department at the time of notification of Ph.D. Entrance Examination and will be notified accordingly.

6. Entrance Test

- **6.1** Entrance test shall be based on MCQ type questions. There shall be 100 MCQ each of 1mark. Duration for this shall be of 120 minutes.
- **6.2** The syllabus of the Entrance Test shall consist of 50% of general awareness, verbal ability, quantitative ability, data interpretation, analysis, synthesis, reasoning, basics of computing and research aptitude and 50% shall be subject specific.
- 6.3 Validity of entrance test score is of two years from the date of Entrance test result.

6.4 For course details scholars are requested to refer university website or the concerned Department of the University.

7. Fees

Fees per year shall be as per schedule in the University Fee-Structure.

8. Allocation of Supervisor

The allocation of the Supervisor for a selected scholar shall be decided by (DRIC/URIC) of the University.

9. Ethical Committee Clearance

A. Ethical committee clearance for experiments on human subjects

- 1. The University Ethical Committee should study the proposed research project work and should give the clearance to conduct the research and sign the certificate of the Ethical Committee clearance enclosed in the Ph.D., Registration Application Form.
- 2. Absence of the Ethical Committee Clearance will be deemed as an incomplete Application which will be rejected.

B. Ethical committee clearance for experiments on animals

- 1. Animal studies should give the consent and approval of the Animal Ethical Committee of the University.
- 2. The Animal Ethical Committee may be constituted as per CPSCEA guidelines.

10. Course work: Structure, Credit, Content, Assessment/Evaluation

- 10.1 Once the Research scholar is admitted to Ph.D. programme, he/she shall undertake course work organised by the University. The course work shall be treated as a pre-Ph.D. preparation.
- 10.2 The course work will be carried out in the departments of the University. Under special circumstances scholar may be permitted to complete the course work outside the University at recognized centres subject to prior permission by the University.
- 10.3 The Scholar on successful completion of the course work will be required to submit his/her proposed synopsis. Thereafter, on the approval by Research Degree Committee (RDC), Topic of the Scholar will be registered for pursuing Ph.D. programme.

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10.4 If the Scholar fails to complete the course work he/she will be required to pursue it again (only one chance) as per rules.

10.5 The structure for Ph.D. course work for all disciplines is as given below:

10.6 COURSE WORK ASSESSMENT:

The rules given below are specified for the examination scheme mentioned in the particular course work structure

10.6.1 Continuous Assessment:

The evaluation of the course work shall be continuous, internal and external. Field work, seminar, review of research papers, etc., shall form part of continuous and internal evaluation. At the end of the course work all the research scholars shall have to appear for external examinations. The continuous assessment of Ph.D. course work for all disciplines will be done by concerned and appropriate faculty of the research centre.

The continuous assessment of Ph.D. course work of the paper Research Methodology, Subject paper, Research and Publication Ethics, Research and Publication Ethics Practical and Report writing on literature review & Presentation will be evaluated on the basis of the class tests/assignments/case studies etc.

- 10.6.2 A Ph.D. scholar has to obtain a minimum of 55% of marks or its equivalent grade in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade wherever grading system is followed) in the course work in order to be eligible to continue in the programme and submit the dissertation/thesis.
- 10.6.3 Those who fail to obtain a minimum of 55% of marks or its equivalent grade in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade/CGPA in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) in the course work shall have to reappear in all the passing heads or a single passing head as the case may be.
- 10.6.4 The presentation of report writing on literature review will be conducted in the concerned department.

Passing marks in each course and report writing will be 55%.

- 10.7 Scholars shall be required to have at least 75% attendance in the course work or adjust their course work during the weekends by their mandatory presence in the University Campus.
- 10.8 After the successful completion of the course work, research scholar should assign grade on the final mark sheet as per university passing rules and regulations. A certificate regarding course completion shall be given to the research scholar.
- 10.9. A scholar who is not successful in the Research Methodology and/or Subject Specific Course-Work Examination, even at the second time shall not be permitted to continue and his/her registration shall be cancelled.

11. Evaluation Method

11.1 On successful completion of course work, the scholar shall be allowed to undertake research work with his/her Supervisor in respective Departments.

12. Submission of Synopsis and RDC Procedure

- 12.1 The research scholar submits their proposed research work synopsis in DRIC for approval.
- 12.2 Five (05) copies of the approved research work synopsis from DRIC submit to the Research Cell in the prescribed format as provided by the University.
- 12.3 The submitted synopsis of the candidate will be presented by the candidate to the Research Degree Committee (RDC) for registration of their research topic.
- 12.4 After approval of research work synopsis of the scholar the research topics has been registered for Ph.D research work.

Dr. C.V. Raman University, Kota, Bilaspur (C.G.) Guidelines for preparation of Thesis for Ph.D. (Program)

The Ph.D. Thesis is an important academic document that reflects the research aspirations and objectives of the University, and has an infinite life time. A good Thesis should be clear and unambiguous and have a logical structure that should assist the reader's, understanding of the argument being presented. Therefore, it is expected, to comply with the following general guidelines. On completion of research work, the summary of Ph.D. Thesis has to be submitted prior to the final submission of Thesis

SUMMARY FORMAT

- 1. The summary of the *Thesis* shall be submitted in 01 spiral copy (**MS Word**) in all the corrections and suggestions as recommended before.
- 2. Summary of the Thesis should be concise, comprehensive and should have the following details: -
 - ❖ Title Page (Outer Cover) as per the format given in Annexure I
 - ❖ Title Page (Inner Cover) as per the format given in Annexure II
 - ❖ Table of content (Annexure VI)
 - Chapter 1 Introduction
 - Chapter 2 Literature Review
 - **❖** Chapter 3
 - ❖ Chapter 4
 - ❖ Chapter.....
 - Chapter : Results and Discussion
 - * References/Bibliography
 - Appendix
 - List of Research Paper Published
 - * Reprints of the Published Research Papers.
- 3. Reprints of all papers & other relative documents as mention in 18.1.4 must be attached with the summary of the thesis.
- 4. Acceptance letter will not be considered as published research paper.
- 5. The Research scholars are advised to strictly adhere to the format.
- 6. After successful presentation of the Spiral Summary of the Thesis by the scholar, he/she will be eligible for submission of his/her Ph.D. Thesis within one months from the date of summary presentation.

THESIS FORMAT

The Thesis consists of three main parts (i) The Preliminaries (ii) The Text (iii) Annexure. It is to be arranged in the following sequence.

- ❖ Chapter –I tocontinue according to the table of contents.

THE TEXT OF THE THESIS

The text the thesis is usually divided in to chapters with subheadings, within the chapters to indicate the orderly progression of topics and their relation to each other.

Chapter-I Introduction: - The thesis should normally begin with a general introduction presenting an overview of the purpose and significance of the study. The introduction should show why the topic selected is worth investigating. This will normally be done with reference to existing research, identifying areas that have not been explored, need to be explored. The final section of the introduction should provide a brief overview of each of the main chapters that the reader will encounter.

Chapter-II Review of Related Literature: - The purpose of the literature review is to summarize, evaluate and compare the main developments and current database in the field which are specifically relevant to the subject of research embodied in the thesis.

Chapter-III Methodology Adopted & Procedure: - The supervisor and the student may decide how this part of the thesis should be structured. Although this section varies depending up on method and analysis technique chosen, the chapter describes and justifies the methods chosen for the study and why this method was the most appropriate.

Chapter-IV Observation & Analysis: -Observations, Analysis and Interpretation should be done as per data collected from sample.

Chapter-V Result & Discussion: The results are actual statement of observations, including statistics, tables and graphs. Do not present the same data as graph as well as table. Use one of the appropriate styles of presentation. The purpose of this chapter is not just to reiterate the findings but discuss the observation in relation to the theoretical body of knowledge on the topic.

Chapter-VI Conclusion, Summary and Suggestions: Start with a few sentences that summarize the important results and conclude by giving the strongest and most important statement that highlights the outcome of the study. The conclusion should provide answers or solutions to the questions or problems raised in the introduction chapter.

Reference/Bibliography Citation in Text: Citation in the text usually consists of the name of the author(s) and the year of the publication. The page no is added when utilizing a direct quotation. It should be arranged alphabetically.

3. Margins.

At least $1\frac{1}{4}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches (3.17-3.81cm) on the left-hand side, 3/4 - 1 inch (2 -2.54cm) at the top and bottom of the page, and about $\frac{1}{2}$ - 0.75 inches (1.27 - 1.90cm) at the outer edge. The best position for the page number is at top-center or top right $\frac{1}{2}$ inch (1.27 cm) below the edge. Pages containing figures and illustration should be suitable paginated.

- **4.** The *Thesis* shall be computer typed (English- British, Font Style -Times Roman, Size-12 point, **Hindi-** Font Style -Krutidev-10, Size-14) and printed on A4 size paper.
- 5. The *Thesis* shall be typed on one side only with double space with appropriate margin.
- 6. Use only standard abbreviations. Avoid abbreviations in the title. The full term for which an abbreviation stands should precede its first use in the text except in case of measurement units. The measurement units if any shall be followed consistently.
- 7. Maintain uniformity in writing the Thesis.
- 8. All copies of the *Thesis* are to be bound in colored hard cover (according to color code) of the *Thesis*.
- 9. Title of the *Thesis*, the name of the supervisor(s) and the scholar should also be incorporated in a vertical manner in the binding spine (outer vertical edge) of the *Thesis*.
- 10. The final submission of the *Thesis* shall be in 03 hard bound copies and 02 soft copy (MS Word) in a CD along with all the corrections and suggestions as recommended before.

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15. Thesis Evaluation

- 15.1 The Ph.D. thesis submitted by a research scholar shall be evaluated by at least two external examiners, who are not in employment of the University, CVRU.
- 15.2 A panel of at least six (6) examiners which consisting of three (3) members each from within state and outside state. The VC will appoint any two examiners (one from each category) for evaluation.
- 15.3 The examiner shall have to send the evaluation report in a given period of time from the date of receipt of the thesis. In case of delay in thesis evaluation, VC may appoint another examiner from the panel of examiners.
- 15.4 On receipt of satisfactory evaluation reports from both the experts and including a specific recommendation for conducting the viva-voce examination, scholar shall undergo a viva voce examination which shall be open to be attended by Members of the Department Research Innovation Committee (DRIC) and University Research Innovation Committee (URIC), all faculty members of the Department, other research scholars and other interested experts/researchers. Report of viva-voce examination shall be submitted to the university.
- 15.5 Panel of Viva voce shall consist of supervisor and at least one of the two external examiners of the thesis evaluation.
- 15.6 On receipt of satisfactory report of viva voce examination the scholar shall be awarded Ph.D. degree. Also, a softcopy of the Ph. D. thesis is to be submitted to the INFLIBNET by the University, so as to make it accessible to all Institutions/Colleges.
- 15.7 In case of modification suggested by experts, the same shall be incorporated in thesis under the advice of the supervisor and to be approved by the experts who has

suggested modification once again. In such case scholar will have to pay fee of one more term.

15.8 In case of non-satisfactory performance in viva voce examination, one more chance shall be given to scholar to reappear for viva voce examination with prescribed fees.

In case of a non-satisfactory performance again, Ph.D. degree shall not be awarded.

Note*: The thesis evaluation fee shall be paid during the submission of the thesis.
